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## **Judges :**

**Kim Adelman** – Filmmaker who began her career as a co-producer of the independent feature *Just Friends*. Ms. Adelman then produced 19 shorts that have played in more than 150 festivals, winning more than 30 awards. She has authored two film books, *Making It Big in Shorts, Third Edition* and *The Ultimate Guide to Chick Flicks*, and currently writes for Indiewire, the leading news source on independent film. Ms. Adelman received the UCLA Extension Department of the Arts

Outstanding Instructor of the Year Award in 2014 and the Distinguished Instructor Award in 2016.

**Jerell Rosales** – Award-winning writer/director whose films have been officially selected at nearly 70 film festivals worldwide. His most recent work is the feature film *High School Lover* for Lifetime/A&E starring James Franco and François Arnaud. He has an MFA in directing from UCLA.

**Fernando Scarpa** – Award-winning director who has achieved extensive international recognition in Europe and in the United States. A graduate of the motion picture directing program at New School University of New York City, since 2011 he teaches the ‘Directing Movies/TV Workshop’ and the ‘Advanced Directing Workshop’ at UCLA Extension Entertainment Studies in Los Angeles.

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## **Industry Panel:**

### ***Using Your Film Festival Experience to Leverage Your Career***

So your short film is accepted into a film festival—what next? Short films are a calling card for filmmakers and many aspire to make a feature as a next step in their career. The panel discusses the creative issues related to transitioning from short films to features, including the story: a new concept or as an expansion of the existing short film?; how to attract the best talent for the available budget; the delights and challenges of shooting with a larger budget; and how to package your project to insure it gets made.

#### **Moderator:**

**Kim Adelman** – Filmmaker who began her career as a co-producer of the independent feature *Just Friends*. Ms. Adelman then

produced 19 shorts that have played in more than 150 festivals, winning more than 30 awards. She has authored two film books, *Making It Big in Shorts, Third Edition* and *The Ultimate Guide to Chick Flicks*, and currently writes for Indiewire, the leading news source on independent film. Ms. Adelman received the UCLA Extension Department of the Arts Outstanding Instructor of the Year Award in 2014 and the Distinguished Instructor Award in 2016.

### **Panelists:**

**Lydia Cedrone** – With over 20 years of experience in the entertainment industry, Ms. Cedrone has managed feature film financing at the Walt Disney Company, oversaw production at Michael Mann’s Forward Pass Inc., as well as produced her own films independently including *The Betrayed* and *In Memorium*. She also works as a producing consultant on multiple features.

**Priscilla Gonzalez Sainz** – An experienced director, producer and editor. Ms. Gonzalez has worked as an independent film producer – primarily in documentaries – and also worked in television distribution. She has also been a film curator and strategist for independent film financing and distribution.
